June 2023 RDO Update: Highlands, Islands and Moray/Aberdeen and Aberdeen-shire

As the end of the Badminton Season approached, it was obvious that the badminton communities in the Highlands, Islands and Moray/Aberdeen and Aberdeen-shire had much to celebrate.

As everyone is aware the COVID Pandemic has impacted sport and local communities greatly. So much that we are only beginning to see the impact the illness has had on our sport now, however, as Clubs, Associations and Groups in the Area begin the slow process of recovery and to re-engage with key partners within our local communities, there are many highlights we can all share in and enjoy. Some of which are outlined below.

Formal Coach Education – The bedrock of the development in our sport in our badminton communities has made a return to the Area.

➤ Badminton Basics - The last four weeks saw the delivery of three Badminton Basics Courses in Forres, Wick and Aberdeen delivered by established Tutors, Angela Bell and Jane Grant. Great learning opportunities for the potential courses as well as being great fun.

The course saw Angela B. being shadowed throughout the day with a potential new tutor – Simon Green.

We are fortunate, in the area, that we have several experienced coaches wanting to begin the process of becoming a Tutor and we all look forward to working with them.

Participants attended, from different backgrounds and sources – Club members local to the venue; players with several years' experience; players on some of our player development pathways; senior school pupils and parents. A great depth of knowledge and experiences being shared in friendly, fun environments.

As part of the development of coaching in the North of Scotland: Badminton Scotland and Area Groups are working together on a year-long calendar of Coach Education for new and existing coaches. The Calendar will offer the delivery of Badminton Basics, Level 1, Level 1+ and Level 2 formal coach education courses as well as comprehensive CPD Courses local to the needs of our badminton communities, thereby reducing the need to travel huge distances to venues in the Central Belt.

- ➤ The first Level One and Level One Plus Courses in the Area for over two years are booked into Moray Sports Centre on the following dates and booking will open soon; Level One 8th/9th and 30th September 2023
