Perth

Perth & District Badminton Association League

Thirteen teams entered the PDBA league for 2023/24, one more than in 2022/23 with Glenearn D making a welcome return to the league.

Six teams competed in Division 1 with some closely competed matches, particularly between the mid-table teams. Forgandenny*, whose team has steadily improved over several years, was undefeated all season and crowned league champion. Forgandenny displaced Perth 20, which had won the league in each of the previous ten seasons.

Seven teams took part in Division 2 and Crieff B, Glenearn C and Kinross B all looked capable of winning the division with the eventual winner only decided when those teams completed their final matches. It was Glenearn C that secured the Division 2 title with a win over Crieff B in their final match of the season.

It's been encouraging to see young talent improving in several of the league teams, particularly Blairgowrie. The success of Forgandenny in nurturing talented young players who have developed into a league winning team should inspire today's emerging talent.

PDBA Cup & Trophy

In the end-of-season cup and trophy events, where each team's score is handicapped, it was Perth 20 that won the PDBA cup for Division 1 teams, perhaps some consolation for the Perth 20 players after missing out on the league title. In the PDBA trophy event for Division 2 teams, Glenearn C won the trophy to complete a league-trophy double. In a curious outcome, Glenearn B finished bottom of Division 1 facing relegation to Division 2 whilst Glenearn C's Division 2 victory means it faces promotion to Division 1!!

*Perth Village Wins Badminton 1st Division

At last after 10 years there is a new name on the Perth & District Badminton Association League Division 1 trophy, and it's Forgandenny BC. Although a small village Forgandenny has produced a winning team able to compete against bigger clubs.Four members of the team were born & bred in Forgandenny, and first picked up a racket in the village hall.Apart from one member the rest stay in the village or in one of the neighbouring villages.

Badminton hasn't always thrived in the village and without the enthusiasm & determination of Nigel Scobie, the club wouldn't be in the position it is now.
