Conditions

- The Tournament will be conducted under the rules of the Badminton World Federation (BWF). A player shall be qualified to enter a Scottish National Championships providing the player satisfies all of the following regulations:
 - is an individual member of and in good standing with Badminton Scotland
 - has not represented any other Member Association for two years immediately preceding the date of the tournament;
 - has not competed in the National Championships of any other Member Association for two years before the tournament;
 - either
 - was born in Scotland or one or both parents were born in Scotland, or
 - has held their main residence in Scotland for two years immediately preceding the date of the tournamentIf in doubt contact Badminton Scotland for clarification. To 'be in good standing' includes being a member of Badminton Scotland.
- Players' first right of entry is to their own age group. They may however enter an older age group subject to the right of refusal if numbers are excessive. Each player can only play in one age Group per National Championships weekend. The declarations on the Entry Form must be completed by each competitor.
- All matches will be played in accordance with the BWF Laws of Badminton. Details of these Laws can be found on the Badminton Scotland website www.badmintonscotland.org.uk and the BWF website www.bwfbadminton.org. Coaching breaks will be allowed at U19 age group only. Only coaches who are on Badminton Scotland's Coach Register are eligible to deliver coaching breaks. - Victor feather shuttlecocks will be used.
- Players absent when called on to play may be scratched.
- A separate entry should be submitted by each player.
- No pair shall be accepted for a Doubles Event unless Entry Forms have been received from both players. Players indicating "partner required" will be paired where possible.
- The Committee reserve the right to refuse entry.
- Entries to be submitted to Badminton Scotland with the appropriate entry fee, **no later than Monday 18 November 2024**. Online entry available on www.badmintonscotland.tournamentsoftware.com. Start times will be e-mailed to competitors and will be available at www.badmintonscotland.org.uk no later than Wednesday 4 December 2024.
- Late entries and entries sent without the appropriate entry fees are unlikely to be accepted. Late entries may only be accepted at the discretion of the tournament director. There is a financial penalty of £5 per event for late entries to these Championships.
- No entry will be accepted from any player who has taken part in any unauthorised Tournament, League or Match.
- Players must hold themselves ready to play not later than 9.30 am on both days. It is hoped to play all events up to and including quarter-finals plus semi-finals of all mixed doubles on Saturday 7 December 2024, with remaining semi-finals and finals on Sunday 8 December 2024. Exact schedule will depend on the number of entries in each event. Players should be in attendance 20 minutes before the time of their first match and may be called to play 20 minutes prior to the match time shown in the programme. All events are straight knock-out with no consolation events.
- Regarding unannounced withdrawals from tournaments, a warning letter will be sent on the first offence and on a subsequent offence the matter will be referred to the Disciplinary Committee.
- Badminton Scotland is opposed to the use of drugs in sport and is a member of and subject to the anti-doping jurisdiction of the BWF and UKAD. The tournament will be conducted with accordance to the tournament regulation of Badminton Scotland, including the anti-doping rules and tests may be carried out. The anti-doping rules of Badminton Scotland are binding on all athletes, Athlete Support Personnel and other persons participating in this event/tournament. Remember that many common asthma medications, and medications used for other common medical conditions require the player to apply for a Therapeutic Exemption Certificate from UK Sport.
- It is a condition of entry to all events that players shall be prepared, if requested, to undertake a drug test involving the provision of a urine sample under qualified supervision, for subsequent analysis. For all players who will be under 18 on the first day of the tournament the consent of the player's Parent/Guardian is required.
- Photographs and footage recorded during the event and information provided on this form may be used for promotional purposes. Players must advise the Referee on arrival at the Championships if they do not wish to be included in photographs or film footage which may be taken over the course of the Championships.
- CLOTHING AND ADVERTISING.** Clothing and advertising must conform to the BWF Regulations.
