# IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- This event is sanctioned by **Badminton Scotland** as the Disability National Championships.
- All disciplines will have National Championships.
- Please note that play will commence no earlier than 9.00 am.
- There will be NO classification of Physical or Learning Disability players at the event. LD players must complete and return the **Player Rating Form as instructed to David Gillespie no later than 3 February 2025. dgillespie@lineone.net**
- The Organising Committee reserve the right to combine divisions and/or categories where it is deemed appropriate to do so.
- The tournament will be run under the regulations of BWF and **Badminton Scotland**.
- All players must be affiliated to **Badminton Scotland**.
- A player shall be qualified to enter a Scottish National Championships providing the player satisfies all of the following regulations:
  - (a) is in good standing with **Badminton Scotland**
  - (b) has not represented any other Member Association for two years immediately preceding the date of the tournament;
  - (c) has not competed in the National Championships of any other Member Association for two years preceding the tournament;
  - (d) either
    - (i) was born in Scotland or one or both parents were born in Scotland
    - or
    - (ii) has held their main residence in Scotland for two years immediately preceding the date of the tournament

If in doubt contact **Badminton Scotland** for clarification. To “be in good standing” includes being a member of **Badminton Scotland**.

Entries must be sent to: **Peter Dean, Badminton Scotland, Sir Craig Reddie Badminton Centre, 40 Bogmoor Place, Glasgow G514TQ** accompanied by the appropriate entry fee **no later than 3 February 2025**. Players indicating “partner required” will be paired where possible.

- Coaching breaks will be allowed.
- Victor shuttlecocks will be used exclusively.
- All elimination draws and PD matches will be 3 sets to 21 with extended scoring. All LD pool matches will be 3 sets to 21 with no extended scoring. All semi-finals and finals will be 3 sets to 21 with extended scoring.
- Please remember that photography is only permitted at the event if you have obtained permission from the Referee. People wishing to do so may request a permit from match control.
- Photographs and footage recorded during the event and information provided on this form may be used for promotional purposes. Players must advise the Referee if they do not wish to be included in photographs which may be taken over the course of the Championships.
- Players, Coaches, Officials, Parents and Volunteers shall be expected to abide by their governing bodies ‘Code of Conduct’. Please ensure you refer to these conditions prior to the event.
- LD classified athletes will not be accepted without a responsible coach/individual nominated and present throughout the tournament.
- Please note that in ALL situations, the Referee’s decision shall be final.



## Scottish Disability National Badminton Championships

### Players Code of Conduct

The aim of *Badminton Scotland* is to create a lively sporting environment, and to promote the spirit of the game, through the exclusion of unethical behaviour, which will not be tolerated.

I the athlete/coach and volunteer agree to the following:

1. Treat all others as you would like to be treated, with integrity politeness and admiration.
2. Practice, play and spectate within the spirit of the game.
3. Help each other to learn new skills.
4. Compete as individuals and partners.
5. Give respect to others - coaches, officials, other players, team managers, parents who help organise/ officiate and play the sport.
6. Accept final decisions from event referee and court umpires and officials.
7. Do not direct verbal, physical, emotional abuse towards opponents/coaches/umpires/partners/event organisers/spectators & other team members.
8. Arrive 20 minutes before your first match each day to ensure adequate preparation and to be punctual on all occasions, inform event organisers of any injuries which cause you to withdraw from matches.
9. Respect when officials are working and that their busy role in assisting with the event delivery may make them inaccessible at some times.
10. Respect that the taking of photographs is to be carried out only with the appropriate accreditation and at times that are appropriate during the event or highlighted by the event organisers so as not disturbing competitors or officials.



## **Parental Code of Conduct for Tournaments**

Any player entered in a tournament (domestic or otherwise) is expected to show a responsible attitude in both performance and appearance: this includes arriving in a fit state to participate and behaving appropriately both during and between matches.

Parents/guardians play a vital role in the development of the player. We ask that you adhere to this Parental Code of Conduct.

### **All parents/guardians are asked to adhere to the undernoted:**

1. to ensure, whenever possible, that your child arrives at all tournaments timeously (and at least 20 minutes before scheduled tournament matches);
2. to show respect to fellow parents/guardians; and to demonstrate appropriate social behaviour;
3. never to speak negatively to, or about, other players, in front of your own child or anyone else;
4. to show respect to all coaches and tournament volunteers;
5. to show respect to the decisions of the court officials;
6. to note that you may watch matches, but are asked not to communicate with your child during such matches.
7. to ensure your child is well behaved on and off court;
8. to treat all other players and parents/guardians with respect: without your children's opponents, there would be no matches!;
9. to ensure that your child is collected safely at the end of tournaments, or that they have permission to travel home by other means.

Finally, please note that any instances of poor conduct on the part of any parent/guardian, or breaches of this Code, may result in action being taken against the parent/guardian in question in the form of a ban from attending future tournaments, for a determined period of time.
