This schedule is provisional and subject to change depending on entries received and approval of the referee and the Chair of the Badminton Europe Events Committee. The final frame schedule shall be made at least 20 days before the start of the tournament and shall be published on the organiser's website.

Competitors must be ready to play 20 minutes before their scheduled time. Players not ready to play at the scheduled time will be disqualified. Alterations to the competition schedule due to Television coverage are possible and will be announced by the Referee as soon as it is known. Warm-up on court is limited to 2 minutes.

Players shall not plan their departure less than 2 (two) hours after their last match is planned to conclude. If a player is unable to compete due to early departure, he/she shall be penalised by Forfeiture of rewards (removal of Elite Circuit ranking points and shall not be awarded prizes or prize money). Badminton Europe shall propose to BWF that the gained BWF ranking points are also removed.



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Draw Competition Regulations	The draw will be conducted by Badminton Europe. The tournament will be played in full accordance with the BWF General Competition Regulations (GCR) as well as the Badminton Europe Elite Circuit Regulations. In the event of any dispute, the Referee's decision shall be final.
Format	Men's and Women's Singles, Men's and Women's Doubles, Mixed Doubles (32 in main draw for singles events, 24 in main draw for all doubles events). In accordance with regulation § 9.2 and § 9.3 in BWF Statutes, Section 5.3.3.1: World Ranking System, an event must contain at least 8 (eight) competitors in the first published version of the main draw. If the required number of competitors is not met in the first published version of the main draw, this particular event shall not count towards any ranking, i.e. BEC Elite Circuit Ranking and BWF World Ranking. In accordance with regulation § 9.4 in BWF Statutes, Section 5.3.3.1: World Ranking System, the first published version of the main draw of an event must contain at least 1 (one) entry from a Member other than the hosting Member. If an event does not contain at least 1 (one) entry from a Member other than the hosting Member, this particular event shall not count towards any ranking. Badminton Europe is not liable for any costs incurred by third persons (players, coaches, umpires, team managers etc.) because of an event not having enough competitors to count for the rankings.
Eligible players	All badminton players who are eligible to play for BWF Members.
Entries	Players must have a BWF ID-number to be able to enter and all entries must be made by using the BWF Online Entry System: https://bwf.tournamentsoftware.com/tournament/D5225BE5-4864-4F8E-B0BB-53CC8EEDE1AD If a player does not have an ID number, please contact the BWF office well in advance of the tournament to obtain one.
Entry deadline	Entries must be submitted no later than Tuesday 21 October 2025 at 2359 BWF HQ-time (1559 GMT). No late entries will be accepted. Compliance with GCR 7.9: "In making or authorising entries, the Member concerned is reconfirming its acceptance, and acceptance by the Players being entered, of the BWF's regulations and Disciplinary processes."
Entry fees	Singles: £70 per player, Doubles: £60 per player in each event The Member that enters a player into a BEC Elite Circuit tournament is responsible for paying the entry fees for that player. The entry fees become due if a player is entered and has not been withdrawn when the entry deadline passes. It is recommended that the entry fees are paid by bank transfer, but the organisers can accept cash payment at tournaments. Please note: all bank charges should be paid by the person paying the entry fee.

The entry fees will not be refunded in the case of a withdrawal. For all the withdrawn players the organizers can invoice the entry fee to the relevant Member.

Organisers are allowed to refuse entries if Members or their players have outstanding fees from a previous year.

Any withdrawal after the Monday immediately preceding the draw, for any reason whatsoever, renders the Member concerned liable to an amount of US\$ 150,00 for the inconvenience caused by the withdrawal (as defined in BWF General Competition Regulations).

Any player not showing up for a match at the tournament, without having been withdrawn in advance, renders the Member concerned liable to an additional amount of US\$ 500,00 for the inconvenience caused by the “no show” (as defined in BWF General Competition Regulations).

Prize money will be paid out in cash. No tax will be deducted.

Presentations

During the presentation ceremonies, players may wear tracksuits, but rackets and racket bags are not permitted. No other form of advertising will be permitted. This will be strictly enforced.

The presentation to winners and runners-up will take place immediately after each final match. Players are reminded when booking flights home on Sunday that the finals may not finish until 1800hrs, depending on the start time, and also that they may be selected for dope testing – they should therefore book their flights accordingly. Players shall not plan their departure less than two (2) hours after their last match is planned to conclude.

Practice Facilities

Please note, practice facilities are not in the same venue as the competition. Practice facilities will be located at the Sir Craig Reddie Centre, 40 Bogmoor Place, Glasgow G51 4TQ. Bookings must be made in advance, otherwise we cannot guarantee to provide players with practice facilities. Doping control

Doping control in badminton, in accordance with BWF Anti-Doping Regulations, is conducted out-of-competition and in-competition with the collection of urine and/or blood samples. Athletes are responsible for any substance found in their body. Before an athlete takes any medication, they should check with their doctor, and if necessary, get a Therapeutic Use

Medical Services

A doctor will be available on call and appointments should be made through the Championships Physiotherapy service. A physiotherapist will be available to give assistance with injuries during the period of the Championships. For incidents outside of the playing Arena it is recommended that appropriate insurance be obtained.

Clothing & advertising

Colour, design, lettering and advertising on clothing shall be regulated by BWF General Competition Regulations § 20 to 24. Any breach of these regulations will be forwarded to BWF.

It is mandatory that partners in doubles wear the same colour of the T-shirt and shorts/skirts at all time during play in both the qualification and the main draw. Failing to do so shall result in an administrative fine of 100,00 EUR.

Visas & ETAs

The UK Government has recently updated the rules about authorisation to travel to the UK. From April 2025, **ALL TRAVELLERS TO THE UK** (except British and Irish citizens) will need permission to travel in advance using either an Electronic Travel Authorisation (ETA) or an eVisa.

For people traveling from countries which require a visa to enter the UK the process has not changed and you should apply for your visa in the usual way. Badminton Scotland can provide a letter of invitation to assist your visa application.

If your players and officials require a visa to enter the United Kingdom, we can provide a letter of invitation to assist. Please provide us with the necessary information by returning the enclosed form no later than Monday 6 October 2025. UK Border Agency state that most decisions on VISA applications are made within 3 weeks, but the earlier you apply the more likely you are to receive a decision in time for you to travel. Please note, the letter of invitation we provide does not guarantee entry into the UK and the final decision is made by the UK Border Agency. It is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure that they apply for their visa in sufficient time. Any issues with the visa application need to be dealt with directly, by the applicant, to the Embassy who is dealing with your application. We accept no responsibility for withdrawals made due to late or unapproved visa applications. Where required, special delivery costs to post letters of invitation will be recharged to your Association.



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Accommodation

The official tournament hotel is Leonardo Royal, 80 Jamaica Street, Glasgow, G1 4QG. Rates are £140 for single rooms and £160 for double/twin rooms. Rates for triple rooms are available on request.

The deadline date for hotel bookings is 27 October 2025 (1200hrs GMT). Reservations should **only** be made by contacting Crème Conferences. After the booking deadline any requests must continue to be directed only to Crème Conferences, but we cannot guarantee the special rates offered. Official transport will be available between the Emirates Arena and the official hotel provided the hotel booking has been made with Crème Conferences. We cannot arrange transport to and from other hotels, or those independently booked. Please **do not** make payment directly to the hotel. You should make payment to Crème Conferences for your accommodation.

Accreditation

Requests for accreditation must be made using the accompanying accreditation request form. The deadline for applying for accreditations is Monday 27 October 2025.

Badminton Integrity

Section 2.4 of the BWF Statutes (Code on The Prevention of The Manipulation of Competitions) relates to anti-corruption and anti-match manipulation, and this code applies to all participants at this tournament.

To protect the integrity of BWF sanctioned tournaments, participants are not allowed to bet in any way on badminton matches, shall respect the principle of fair play, and shall not attempt to influence the course or result of a game or match.

Every person has an obligation to report to the BWF any approaches by anyone to gather inside information or to change the outcome of a matches.

Cancellation

The organising Member can cancel a tournament in case of force majeure. Such cancellation must be announced at least 15 days before the start of the tournament. If a cancellation is

announced less than 15 days before the start of the tournament, then the Member organising the tournament is liable for any expenses incurred by third persons (players, coaches, umpires, team managers etc.). Badminton Europe is not liable for any costs incurred by third persons because of a cancellation of a tournament.

Insurance

The Organisers decline responsibility and covering of costs for possible injuries or other damages. It is up to participants to insure themselves.

Member and/or Organiser may be liable for claims originating from the damages incurred by the participants and/or any other persons, arising from or in connection to the particular BEC Elite Circuit tournament, according to local Law. Badminton Europe is not liable for any such claims, actions, damages, costs or expenses of any nature whatsoever, including but not limited to injury or loss to person or property, arising out of or in any way related, directly or indirectly, to the particular BEC Elite Circuit tournament. It is recommended that Member and/or Organisers purchase a proper Insurance Policy that would cover their potential legal liability.
